Adventure in Citizenship 2021 Video Contest

What is Adventures in Citizenship?

In 1951, The Rotary Club of Ottawa established its annual "Adventure in Citizenship" Program in which some 220 senior high school students, from across Canada, spend four days in Ottawa experiencing tours, lectures, discussions, and social events designed to enhance their understanding and appreciation of Canadian citizenship. Public figures including former Governor General Adrienne Clarkson, the Right Hon. Joe Clark, and the Hon. Ed Broadbent participated in the program as students.

This annual event provides a unique opportunity for a selected group of young Canadians to come together to gain a better understanding of our country. Through meetings with political leaders, senior officials and others, they learn a great deal about the workings of our democratic institutions. Through meeting one another and having discussions among themselves, they learn to appreciate the diversity of Canada and the privileges and responsibilities of Canadian citizenship.

This year's program will be held virtually May 1-5, 2021 and the Rotary Club of St. John's Northwest will sponsor the winner of this video contest to attend.

Description

- Entrants will submit a video discussing a topic of their choosing. Please note instructions on the next page.
- Entrants must be a student in high school; Grades 10, 11 or 12.
- The videos must be a maximum of 90 seconds long.
- Videos will be judged on their content and delivery.
- The members of the Rotary Club of St. John's Northwest will select 1 winner who will be notified via email on April 20, 2021.
 1. 1st place will be selected to attend the virtual Adventures in Citizenship conference May 1-5, 2021 and a cash prize of \$100.
 2. A second and third runner up will also be selected, and each receive a cash prize of \$50.
 3. If the winner is unable to attend the virtual conference, the second runner up will be asked to attend.
- Deadline to enter: April 15, 2021
- Winner selected and notified on April 20, 2021

- Video submissions must be received no later than April 15, 2021 by 5:00pm NL standard time.
- Video files can be in either a MP4, MOV or WMV format.
- One video per student, multiple videos per student are not permitted.

- All videos submitted will be shared on our Rotary Club of St. John's Northwest social media channels. If an entrant does not want their content to be shared, please indicate that on their email submission.

- Personal attacks, name-calling, bullying and abusive content will not be tolerated.
- We reserve the right to disqualify entrants that do not abide by our community guidelines.
