The Coalition of Persons with Disabilities – Newfoundland and Labrador (COD-NL), in partnership with the West White Rose Project is pleased to provide one scholarship, valued at \$2500.00, to a high school student who self-identifies as living with a disability, and entering post-secondary studies in September 2024.

To be eligible, candidates must be:

- · Graduating from high school;
- · A Canadian citizen who self-identifies as living with a disability;
- · Entering a Canadian post-secondary institution; and
- · Unrelated to any member of the COD-NL Board of Directors or staff

Additionally, successful candidates must be enrolled in a post-secondary program that is within the Oil & Gas Sector, such as:

- Business, Office Administration, or Commerce
- Earth Science
- Engineering or Engineering Technology
- Health & Occupational Safety
- Information Technology
- Supply Chain and Logistics
- Technical Trades
